
### February 9th 2019

#### March 10th 2019

On Sunday, the March 10th, 2019, the Tibetan Association of Philadelphia (TAP) members and supporters commemorated the 60th Anniversary of the Tibetan National Uprising Day in Lhasa, Tibet in 1959. The TAP members and supporters gathered at the Philadelphia's City Building around 2:15 pm. There, the TAP President Tenzin Shakya gave an opening speech followed by reading of CTA President Dr. Lobsang Sangay's 10th March message to Tibetans around the world in Tibetan language. Tashi la, the son of Tsering Jurme read the President's English version of the 10th March message, "Let us continue to strengthen our resilience so that



we can be united with our brothers and sisters In Tibet in freedom. Let us commit to the return of His Holiness the Great 14th Dalai Lama to the Potala Palace in Lhasa-where he rightly fully belongs." President Dr. Lobsang Sangay said.

Then they sang Tibetan National Anthem and observed a minute silent prayer for those who lost their lives for the freedom of Tibetans people in Tibet under brutal Communist Chinese rule. With more vigils, Prayers and chanting slogans continued,

"Free Tibet now,' "China out Tibet." 'Long Live Dalai Lama." While

marching towards the Liberty Bell Hall to continue our vigils there. This place is very significant for freedom and Liberty. It is very much relevant with our very struggle for freedom.

At 4pm at the Liberty Bell, Kasur Lobsang Dhargyal la spoke and highlighted the significant of 10th March. Mr. Jeff spoke in length the Chinese communist atrocities committed on Tibetans. The Vice-President Thupten Monlam la read the 10th March message of the Tibetan Parliament in Exile. Wangyal la, the son of Thupten la spoke about the 10th march in Tibetan language beautifully. Sonam Tobgyal also spoke. The 10th March vigil continued until late evening with Rise Up songs and 10th March memorial song.




the news clip.


### November 30th 2019
